Connecticut Magazine ranked Harwinton #2 in Quality of Life towns of 3,500-6,500 population in 2012. The town is located in close proximity to the educational, cultural and business opportunities afforded by the cities of Hartford, Waterbury and Torrington.

Harwinton and neighboring Burlington comprise Regional School District #10. Connecticut statewide test scores place this district's students in the top tier of the state.

Harwinton has maintained its rural agrarian tradition, with several working farms still in operation today.

There are several horse farms, including those providing stable and riding opportunities.

There are ample fishing and hunting opportunities available, as well as passive recreation and hiking. The Roraback Wildlife Management Area provides nearly 2,000 acres of protected open space, designated hunting areas, as well as numerous hiking trails.

Recreational opportunities include Fairview Farms, an 18 Hole Golf Course. Encompassing 170 acres, it is one of Connecticut's most picturesque and playable public golf courses and also offers a first-class restaurant and banquet facility.


