Q: What is the Troop L & A Police Cadet Program?

A: The Troop L & A Police Cadet Program is a law enforcement run community policing program designed to expose youths, from the age of 13-20 years old, to what a career in law enforcement is really like.

Q: What do you learn at the Troop L & A Police Cadet Program?

A: A typical Police Cadet meeting begins with a formal roll call and a uniform inspection. Following the uniform inspection, Troopers prepare a classroom lecture about the topic we will be covering for that night. The topics we cover on an annual basis consist of, motor vehicle stops/enforcement, criminal investigations, interview tactics, report writing, and operating under the influence enforcement. After our classroom portion, the Cadets get to participate in hands-on role playing scenarios where they put their training to the test.

Q: Where do you meet, and how often?

A: The Troop L & A Police Cadet program meets weekly on Thursday nights, from 0600pm to 0830pm at the Litchfield Troop L State Police barracks, located at 452 Bantam Road in Litchfield. Transportation to and from the meeting is required. There is no cost to join the program.
